

10	<p>At some stage after their departure from Port Pirie, Mr Allen commences consuming pre-mixed alcoholic drinks contained in an esky in the rear cargo area of the car. Allen and Mr Martlew continue to [<i>drink</i>] steadily thereafter during the course of the journey to Kadina via Port Broughton, Wallaroo and Port Victoria. For some of the journey, Ms Chadwick passes cans of drink to Mr Allen from the esky in the car.</p> <p><i>Mr Allen's memory of the day overall was patchy, with no recollection at all after they visit the playground.
